- g) What is the "great clod of clay" that has "got itself mixed up" with the "purity" of inspiration?
- h) What according to Woolf are the impressions that an ordinary mind receives on an ordinary day?
- i) How does Woolf designate the works of Fielding and Austen?
- j) In "out of 'that' alone must he construct his work", what is Woolf referring to by "that"?
- k) In which respect is "the critical method or habit of the French" different from that of the English?
- 1) Under what condition, according to Eliot, should tradition be "discouraged"?
